HORNBECK-LEEAC Announces New Chairman of the Board and New Chief Executive Officer

HORNBECK-LEEAC Marine Services, Inc. announced today that the Board has made certain changes in its senior management. Todd M. Hornbeck has been appointed to the position of Chief Executive Officer in addition to his current position as President. Bernie W. Stewart has been elected Chairman of the Board and has entered into a consulting agreement with the Company. Carl G. Annessa, a Vice President of the Company, has been elected to the additional position of Chief Operating Officer. Mr. Christian G. Vaccari will remain as a director of the Company.

Previously, he served as Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the original Hornbeck Offshore Services, Inc., and prior to that as President of Western Oceanics, Inc.

Mr. Annessa has served as the Company's Vice President of Operations since 1997 and was previously employed for seventeen years by Tidewater, Inc. in various technical and operational management positions, including management of large fleets of offshore supply vessels in various international arenas. Mr. Annessa is a naval architect.
